## **ETHICAL STANDARS OF MEDICAL PHOTOGRAPHY**

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1	The image is the exclusive property of the patient and part of his/her dignity. He/
	She may share it with you, as a whole or part of it, always having the right to
	consult, copy, modify or delete the stored information.
2	The reason for taking a picture of a medical process must be ethically honest (for
	better patient care, share knowledge, by teaching or research)
3	Proper authorization must be granted by the patient via the Consent form that
	should be stored. If there is an emergency, it must be requested afterwards.
4	The photo should be framed in a way to exclusively reveal the area of medical
	interest. If necessary cover other exposed areas (sheets, clothing, etc) This is
	mandatory for under age patients
5	Do not photograph the patient's face. If this is not possible, then it must be
	anonymized by cropping (blurring is not recommended)
6	Personal bodily markings such as moles, scars, tattoos should not be included in
	the images you share unless they are the subject matter; then the frame will
	be exclusively of these elements
7	Do not include any patients' data in your images, their name or any of their
	affiliation data (address, phone number, date of birth, etc.)
8	Avoid showing logos or images that can identify the Centre, Hospital or even
	country of assistance.
9	Never photograph under-age patients without parents' authorization
10	If you photograph on-screen reports or results, they must not include any data of
	the patient or health center; crop or trim them afterwards if necessary
